

Bellers, a Quaker social reformer, regarded the social conscience as the foundation of political authority in striking contrast to the official church outlook, the Calvinist theory of the state and to such secular theories as those of Locke and Hobbes. Many of Bellers's social views largely anticipated those of Robert Owen - notably Bellers's plan outlined in Proposals for Raising a College of Industry for the improvement of the material and spiritual condition of the workers. Bellers also emphasized the importance of educating the criminal, advocated reform of criminal law, and in common with William Penn suggested a type of league of nations to eliminate national rivalries.




