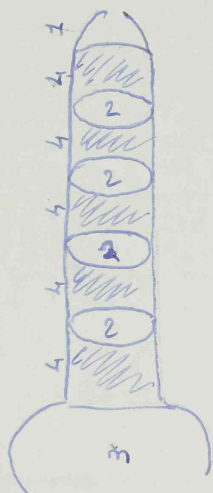

The body ought to be washed once a day, or sponged with fresh water, or at the very least once a week, during the bathing season, as the pores are closed by the crystallizing of the salt of the sea water, which the fresh water cleans out and removes. Salt water does not clean and wash the skin. The head and the hair ought to be washed once a week, to clean away the salt particles, as also the sand at the roots. There are many more trifling remarks which might be made, but many refer to individual cases, which being the case, each knowing it, will be able to remedy it in such a way as may suit themselves.

No. 1 is the point, the opening at which must not be large enough to allow the fingers to get in, nor be so small as to prevent the urine from getting easily out. Nos. 2 are a number of oval openings, placed on the four sides of the instrument, and at short distances, and irregularly; there must not be one within an inch of the point. The oval apertures are made to put
