I have no doubt you will be satisfied with the work when it appears, for it will embrace a very interesting period of history, and developp the caractere of a man, who has has not only gained an elevated mark among the great good, but whose

influence on the destinies of the western world has been incalculable. It is a great satisfaction to me, that his fame, in regard to that portion of mankind who read in French language, will [...] in your hands. I am sure you will deem Washington a subject worthy of your thoughts and your pen.

Dear Sir,

I had the pleasure to write to you from London in March last, and accept your obliging offer to exchange our journals, that is, the North American Review for the Revue Française. I have not yet received a number of your work, but I suppose this has been owing to some derangement in the mode of conveyance. Mr. Kilian (No. 3 Rue Stoisseau) is agent for my journals, and will supply you regularly with the numbers as they arrive in Paris. Meantime will you have the goodness to request your publisher to send the Revue Française to Mr. Kilian for me promptly as it comes from the press? I should be glad to have the work from the beginning, & if you will order a copy to be sent to me, I will direct a copy of the N. A. Review to be sent to you for the same periods.

I am now closely occupied in preparing for the press the "Diplomatic Correspondence of the American Revolution". These papers are published by order of Congress, and they will make an interesting collection of historical materials relating to the foreign transactions of the American war, and particularly to the part which France acted in those events. They embrace all the public correspondence of Franklin and Adams, while they were in Europe. The whole series will amount to 8 or 10 volumes. They are now in press, and will be completed in about six months, when I shall send you a copy.

Washington's papers are also in preparation, but they are retarded a little by the work above mentioned. I trust that before many months, however, I shall be able to send you the first volume. At all events I hope you will not lose your interest
