Dear Sir,

I was glad to learn by your letter, that the Diploma had safely reached your hands, and that you were pleased with this token of respect from our University.

You requested me to procure for you a copy of the "Lives of Mary & Martha Washington", & also of the "Works of John Adams". The editor of this work was much pleased with an opportunity of placing it in your possession. I presume you have received a letter from him on the subject. I also forwarded in the same parcel a copy of "Hamilton's Works", in seven volumes, recently published by the Congress of the United States. I remember you expressed a wish to obtain the writings of Hamilton whenever they should be printed. Please to accept these

volumes as a testimony of my regard & grateful recollections.

All the above books were sent by a publisher in Boston to Mr. Hector Bossange, Quai Voltaire, and I doubt not he has conveyed them to you.

I am now employed in writing a "History of the Foreign Relations of the United States during the War of the American Revolution." In executing this task you will naturally suppose that I rely chiefly on the very interesting & valuable materials obtained by your kind permission, from the "Archives des Affaires Etrangères." Mr. Mignet was somewhat reluctant to permit these papers to leave the Archives. He assured us improper use will be made of them. They afford the only means of arriving at a clear & full explanation of the part taken by the French government in the American War, and they prove the entire fidelity of that government to all their

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pledges to the United States; thus veri-
fying the declaration made to me
by M. de Marbois during my first
visit to Paris. They will correct many
errors into which our American
writers have fallen, misled alike by
an ignorance of facts & the spirit
of party.
