Dear Mr Guizot

I think I told you very distinctly that we had engaged ourselves to sleep Duckworth for the 10th - to stay till the 16th - but for fear of mistakes, I write again, as any thing that arrives here, would undergo a day's delay.

I presume indeed you have given up all idea of the 15th which is now physically impossible, even if I staid at home that, I am sure you would not wish me to do. I already

refused Miss D. - in
1844 as I think I told you,
for fear of delaying
my book, & now all is
arranged, & various parties
agreed to meet us. Above
all, my husband has
agreed to go, & this
state is
so important, that I would
rather do any thing than
give it up. He would
not go without me, &
after the 15th Miss D.
is engaged till he leaves
town. On the 24th we go
to stay a week at

Abbotsford.
I have not corrected the
last proof. half a sheet,
received this morning.
indeed I have soon de-
cid on an hour - as Mr
Murray will tell you.
What I may be able to do
in London, I cannot say
but you know that I
will do my very utmost
to write in extreme haste
five minutes before post
time. I cannot tell you
therefore all I would say
from affectionate anxiety
about you requires our
important thought of you.

I have just heard from
John M. M. M. who
seems forlorn. I will
see what I can do to
cheer him. Have you given
