Monsieur le Ministre.

I have the honour at last of sending you the second part of my History of Ludlow (or rather of the border of Wales) to which you are a subscriber. Although I have been so long about it, it is at last but a very hasty performance.

I hope in a few weeks to have the satisfaction of offering you a volume of the original letters relating to the invitation and suppression of the English monasteries in the time of Henry VIII, which I am publishing rather as a check to the statements of our Puritans, in order to show how little they are founded in truth. The original documents of history have been so much neglected, that there is a large party in our Church who have quite forgotten that the Reformation was either called for by circumstances, or that it was any benefit to the country.

Permit me, Monsieur, to express my humble but very hearty congratulations on the success with which you have again combated and overcome the political difficulties with which you have had to contend, and to hope that you will long continue to do so for the good not only of France but of all the world.
