My dear M. Guizot

I thank you very much
for your kind recollection of me in
sending me a copy of your History
of the English Revolution. Permit me
to beg your acceptance in return of
a very thin volume, if you will deign
to exchange *ῥεῦμα λαλῶντων*,
ἐναργεῖς *ἐννεαβόλον*. There
also added, as it may interest
you as a Member of the Faculty
which has at Oxford, a letter
on the Law Studies of the University.
How many such exchanges

events have happened since that
lost the pleasure of seeing you in
Paris. Meanwhile you have rested
on the bank, and whilst watching
the play of water before you,
"deum maius magis" have turned
your gaze back on a period
of our history as full of interest
perhaps even more anomalous -
who would have supposed that
the Restoration of Charles II
was broken in the abdication
of James II! Are you likely to
pass the autumn at Val Richier?

Whilst my wanderings are generally
directed further Eastward - but I
shall be very glad if you should be tempted
to run over to England to examine
some of our private collections
of MSS. There is a collection at
East Hampstead, belonging to the
Marquis of Blandford, which my
friend Mr. Popham of Littleport
tells me, is most valuable, and
which nobody has been allowed
to examine. I will endeavor to
arrange for you to see them, if
you should feel disposed to visit
England, and my house would

be quite at home during
your stay in London, where I
will promise for a room looking
upon the Park with the least
amount of "city smoke" -

I have sent this through our
Foreign Office. I think the decision
upon the matter of merit has
henceforth been observed by the
parties who have signed the Treaty
of Paris is a step forward in
civilization. Believe me
