18. The suggested form of the  
law in the Senate of the nation is as  
follows:—

Section 1. The Congress of the  
United States shall have the power  
to regulate the commerce of the  
United States with foreign nations,  
and among the several states, and  
with the Indian tribes; and to make  
all laws which shall be necessary  
and proper for carrying into execu-  
tion the foregoing powers, and for  
all other powers vested by this  
Constitution in the Government  
of the United States, or in any  
Department or Officer of the  
United States, or in any  
place or part of the United States,  
not otherwise provided for.

Section 2. The Congress shall have  
power to lay and collect taxes  
on incomes, trades, and  
professions, and on  
articles imported into the  
United States, and to regulate  
the value of money; and to  
make all laws which shall be  
necessary and proper for carrying  
into execution the foregoing  
powers, and for all other  
powers vested by this  
Constitution in the Government  
of the United States, or in any  
Department or Officer of the  
United States, or in any  
place or part of the United States,  
not otherwise provided for.
